The FY 1999 SuperNOFA announced the availability of approximately \$2.4 billion in HUD program funds covering 32 grant programs and program components administered by the following HUD offices: the Office of Community Planning and Development (CPD); the Office of Housing-Federal Housing Administration (FHA); the Office of Public and Indian Housing (PIH); the Office of Policy Development and Research (PD&R); the Office of Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity

(FH&EO); and the Office of Lead Hazard Control.

On May 18, 1999 (64 FR 27120), HUD published a notice that, among other things, extended the deadline for certain programs in the SuperNOFA to accommodate areas that were designated disaster areas as a result of the tornados in early May 1999. The May 18, 1999 notice republished for the convenience of the readers the introduction section of the SuperNOFA to reflect updates to programs and application due date changes.

In both the February 26, 1999 SuperNOFA and in the May 18, 1999 extension notice, HUD advised, in the introduction section, that the SuperNOFA application rating system provides for up to two bonus points for eligible activities/projects that the applicant proposes to be located in high performing federally designated Empowerment Zones (EZs) or Enterprise Communities (ECs). HUD also advised that it would publish in the Federal **Register** the list of high performing EZs and ECs.
