Dear Commissioner: This directive amends, but does not cancel, the directive issued to you on January 24, 1996, by the Chairman, Committee for the Implementation of Textile Agreements. That directive concerns imports of certain cotton, wool, man-made fiber, silk blend and other vegetable fiber textiles and textile products, produced or manufactured in Taiwan and exported during the twelve-month period which began on January 1, 1996 and extends through December 31, 1996.

Effective on October 11, 1996 you are directed to adjust the limits for the following categories, as provided under the terms of the current bilateral textile agreement concerning textile products from Taiwan:

SUMMARY: The Army has prepared a DEIS for the relocation of the U.S. Army Chemical School and the U.S. Army Military Police School from Fort McClellan, Alabama, to Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. The relocation is part of the approved 1995 Base Closure and Realignment actions mandated by the Base Closure and Realignment Act of 1990 (Public Law 101–510), and subsequent actions in compliance with this law. The DEIS describes the proposed action which involves the relocation of military mission activities, construction of support facilities, and relocation of personnel to Fort Leonard Wood. Alternative methods for implementing this mandated Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) action at Fort Leonard Wood are described and analyzed in the DEIS.
