and extending through October 28, 1999, in excess of $1,250,841$ dozen pairs ${ }^{1}$.
Products in the above categories exported during the period October 29, 1997 through October 28,1998 shall be charged to the applicable category limit for that period (see directive dated February 9, 1998) to the extent of any unfilled bal ance. In the event the limit established for that period has been exhausted by previous entries, such products shall be charged to the limit set forth in this directive.
In carrying out the above directions, the Commissioner of Customs should construe entry into the United States for consumption to include entry for consumption into the Commonweal th of Puerto Rico.
The Committee for the Implementation of Textile A greements has determined that this action falls within the foreign affairs exception of the rulemaking provisions of 5 U.S.C. 553(a)(1).
