Take notice that on December 1, 1998, TransColorado Gas Transmission Company (TransColorado) tendered for filing as part of its FERC Gas Tariff, Original Volume No. 1, the tariff sheets listed on Appendix A to the filing, to be effective January 1, 1999.

In June 1997, El Paso TransColorado Company withdrew as a partner in TransColorado Gas Transmission Company, leaving K N TransColorado, Inc. and Questar TransColorado, Inc. as the two remaining partners. Effective January 1, 1999, El Paso will end its duties as operator and K N Energy, Inc. will become the operator of TransColorado. As a result, certain tariff provisions have been modified to fit the operating requirements of KN's Direct Access Request and Tracking System, which replaces the Electronic Bulletin Board provisions presently being used to operate the TransColorado pipeline system.

TransColorado states that a copy of this filing has been served upon its customers and the Colorado Public Utilities Commission and New Mexico Public Regulatory Commission.

Transcontinental Gas Pipe Line
Corporation; Notice of Proposed
Changes in FERC Gas Tariff

December 4, 1998.

Take notice that on December 1, 1998, Transcontinental Gas Pipe Line Corporation (Transco) tendered for filing as part of its FERC Gas Tariff, Third Revised Volume No. 1, certain revised tariff sheets which tariff sheets are enumerated in Appendix A attached to the filing. Such tariff sheets are proposed to be effective January 1, 1999.

Transco states that the purpose of the instant filing is to reflect the 1999 GRI surcharges approved by the Commission's Order issued on September 29, 1998, in Docket No. RP98-235-000. Also, in accordance with GRI's 1993 settlement, Transco has calculated the firm transportation service load factors on the actual volumes transported during the 12 month period October 1997 through September 1998. The only changes resulting are the reclassification of Baltimore Gas & Electric Company, PG Energy, Inc., South Jersey Gas Company and UGI Utilities, Inc. from the high load factor category to the low load factor category.

Transco states that copies of the filing are being mailed to affected customers and interested State Commissions.
