The FY 2001 awards announced in this Notice were selected for funding in a competition announced in a NOFA published in the **Federal Register** on February 26, 2001 (66 FR 11709). Applications were scored and selected for funding based on the selection criteria in that Notice and Area Office of Native American Programs (ONAPs) geographic jurisdictional competitions.

The amount appropriated in FY 2001 to fund the ICDBG was \$70,843,800 million. Two million of this amount was retained to fund imminent threat grants in FY 2001. Including \$440,861 in unused funds from the amount reserved by the Assistant Secretary in FY 2000 for imminent threat grants, a total of \$69,284,661 were available to fund single purpose ICDBG grants.
